Keynote Speaker

Professor Jorg Imberger, Director of UWA's Centre for Water Research

"The Origins, Engineering Challenges and Opportunities Of Climate Change"

Having recently added the accolade of 'W.A Scientist of the Year' to his impressive list of scientific achievements, Professor Jorg Imberger has long been considered as one of the finest minds in the field of water research. His ideas and designs have been adopted worldwide and are currently benefiting approximately 200 million people around the globe.

A dynamic speaker, Professor Imberger will present an engaging presentation on an issue of global importance and the imperative nature of working collaboratively for sound environmental risk management.

Panel Discussion

The panel discussion is bound to separate the cowboys from the cowards with opportunities to discuss issues pertaining to university research risk management with key player in the field.

Research is a core university activity but risk management is often not adequately or consistently embedded in research activities that pose a large risk. Research permeates an institution at various

levels. The panel discussion will allow delegates to explore the various facets of risk management as it pertains to research.

The topics and their presenters are:

- Professor John Finlay-Jones Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research), Edith Cowan University
Professor Finlay-Jones will address the whole of institution risks as they apply to research.
- Dr Charlie Thorn, Director, ASDI, Curtin University of Technology
Dr Thorn will talk about risks associated with research commercialisation, and the benefits of informed risk-taking.
- Kim Heitman, Director of Legal Services, University of Western Australia
Mr Heitman will address legal risks associated with research.
- Professor Jorg Imberger, Director of UWA's Centre for Water Research
Professor Imberger will consider aspects of risk associated with research projects.

Site Visit

After a shooting, what is the next step? Call the police. An understanding of what the emergency services require is fundamental to both business continuity planning and incident management.

The site visit starts with a tour of the state-of-the-art WA Police Academy, co located with the Edith Cowan University (ECU) Joondalup Campus. The visit will provide delegates with an insight into emergency service requirements.

You will start with a short tour over the \$47 million complex followed by a briefing by the WA Police representatives who would respond to an on campus shooting. You will find out about the Police's role in such incidents and others such as terrorism, and bomb threats including their liaison and required emergency site control arrangements.

Continuing the theme of critical incident management, you will then visit the Nursing Simulation Centre at ECU, recipient of the Innovation in Nursing Award for Western Australia 2008. You will be shown how incident management is taught to professionals such as para-medics and nurses.

Teaching and learning is a key university activity and exposure to the laboratory and its supporting teaching facilities will provide insights into the different methods of delivering learning outcomes to students. From the practitioner's point of view, the tour of the facility will include an interactive demonstration of how incident management can occur with the conduct of a small incident management exercise.
