Standard Immunisations	Schedule	Cost	✓
Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio (ADT)	Once off immunisation as needed, often given every 10-15 years for those at risk.	FREE	
Hepatitis A * (see also Twinrix)	Series of 2 immunisations, often given one month apart	\$55 each	
Hepatitis B * (see also Twinrix)	Series of 3 immunisations, given at 0,1 and 6 months	\$15 each	
Twinrix (Hep A & B combined)	Series of 2 immunisations, often given one month apart, followed by a third Hep B booster at 6 months	\$50 each	
Typhoid	Once off immunisation given every 3 years for those at risk	\$35 each	
Meningococcal C / ACYW	Single strain vaccine - Once off immunisation Multi-strain vaccine - Given every 3 years for those at risk	\$55 each	
Influenza	Annual immunisation often given to those at risk	\$20 each	
Malaria	Short stay prophylaxis – Doxycycline 100mg daily OR Mefloquine (Lariam) 250mg weekly.	Prescription required from GP	
Cholera - Travellers to endemic areas should be advised on careful food and water consumption and personal hygiene. Travellers to endemic areas should carry oral rehydration powder available from pharmacies which must be reconstituted with boiled or sterilised water.		N/A	
Japanese Encephalitis - There is an effective vaccine available, however vaccines are only provided at certified travel agencies in Melbourne. Vaccination requires three doses on days zero, seven and 28 with a booster every three years.		N/A	
Rabies - Pre-exposure vaccination is recommended for people whose occupation or recreational activities place them at increased risk of being bitten or scratched carrier animals. It is also recommended for travellers who will be spending prolonged periods (i.e. more than one month) in rural parts of rabies endemic areas.		N/A	
Yellow Fever - A valid Yellow Fever vaccination certificate is required from all travellers over 9 months of age coming from infected areas. Yellow Fever vaccines are only available from travel centres in Melbourne.		N/A
