La Trobe University, Bendigo 2009/2010 Course Structure

The Master of Education (Applied Learning) is designed to provide higher degree qualifications for those whose study, research and/or professional interests are in the area of applied learning and design. The course offers students the framework to explore applied learning in an Australian context, and the opportunity to enhance their understanding of programs and initiatives in a range of local and/or international settings. The program offers candidates flexibility in modes of study and unit selection, with the opportunity to undertake professional development in their area of interest and to enhance their career opportunities in the wider community and/or teaching profession. The Course consists of six units worth 20 credit points each. The 120 credit point program may be taken over one year full-time or two to three years part-time.

The course is available by all coursework, or a combination of coursework and negotiated research projects.
