1 TITLE OF PRIZE/AWARD/SCHOLARSHIP:

The John Stirling Scholarship

2 CONDITIONS OF PRIZE/AWARD/SCHOLARSHIP:

The value of the scholarship is \$1000 and will be tenable for one year to support students in the Graduate Diploma of Education course undertaking the unit *Studies of Society and Environment Method* at the Bundoora Campus.

Each year there will be ONE Education Scholarship offered by the 2/14th Battalion.

The purpose of this Scholarship is to:

- Promote understanding of the 2/14 Battalion
- Preserve the stories and memory of the soldiers of the 2/14 Battalion
- Support systematic research into the lives and experiences of members of 2/14 Battalion and of their families
- Enable a presentation to be made at the completion of the project to members and friends of the 2/14 Battalion
- Contribute to an ongoing collection of stories and memories of 2/14 Battalion

3 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria to be considered for the Scholarship:

- be an Australian citizen
- be enrolled as a current student in the Graduate Diploma in Education at the Bundoora Campus
- be enrolled in the unit *Studies of Society and Environment Method*

4 SELECTION PROCESS:

Selection by: A Selection Committee consisting of two academic staff from the Bundoora campus, the Registrar (or nominee), and a person nominated by the 2/14th Battalion, will assess applications and award the Scholarship.

Criteria: Selection will be based on:-

1. a proposal submitted by applicants (either individually or in a group) for a research project into the stories and memories of the 2/14th Battalion veterans and their families
2. a detailed outline of the purpose, methodology and outcomes of the research project
3. presentation of a detailed budget for the acquittal of the \$1000 scholarship as well as provision of a timeline outlining milestones for progress

Note: The decision of the Selection Committee will be final.

5 PRESENTATION:

The Award will be formally presented at the annual graduation ceremony for the Bundoora Campus. The payment will be made as soon as practicable after the start of the academic year following the completion of the selection process.
