

To be eligible to participate in Mentoring Works graduates must have taken up positions in publicly funded health care organisations and community services in rural and remote areas of Victoria.

Graduates are defined as those in the first two years of their work life as an allied health professional.

Eligible allied health graduates include: Physiotherapists, Podiatrists, Occupational Therapists, Speech Pathologists, Audiologists, Dietitians, Hospital Pharmacists, Psychologists, Medical Radiation Therapists, Radiographers, Nuclear Medicine Technologists, Music Therapists, Medical Physicists, Medical Laboratory Pathologists and Scientists, Orthoptists, Biomedical Scientists, Radiation Therapists, Medical Physicists and Social Workers.
