Master of Laws in Global Business Law

Global business law students are taught by internationally renowned academics from the world's best universities, including the University of California (Los Angeles), Duke University, Pennsylvania State University, the China University of Politics and Law in Beijing, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and the University of Muenster in Germany.

The structure of the program is ideal for overseas law practitioners or recent graduates who seek quality Master of Law options. The subjects are delivered in a five-day intensive mode during the Australian summer (November-February) and winter (June-July) vacations. The following table is an example of the broad range of subjects available (students must complete a total of eight subjects of their choice):

Master of Laws International

The Master of Laws International is unique in Australia because it allows non-Australian law graduates to study undergraduate law subjects within their Master of Laws degree. This degree is only available to overseas lawyers who have a law degree from their home jurisdiction and who wish to gain advanced qualifications in law and expand their career prospects internationally. This coursework degree can be completed in two semesters.

The structure of the Master of Laws International provides non-Australian lawyers with two career enhancement options:

- complete some or all of the Bachelor of Laws subjects required for legal practice in Australia; or
- specialise in Australian and Global Business Law through a combination of undergraduate and postgraduate subjects and expand career development options in their home country.

Admission to Legal Practice in Australia

An overseas law graduate or practitioner hoping to seek admission to practise in Australia should seek a ruling from the Legal Services Board in Victoria as to the extent to which their existing academic qualifications and practical legal training may be regarded as sufficient. This should be made at least six months before commencing this program and action should be initiated from the applicant's home country. The ruling may require the completion of a number of law subjects as well as an additional period of practical training. The application can be made under the Legal Profession (Admission) Rules 2008. www.justice.vic.gov.au

Advanced Standing

Advanced standing may be granted to suitable applicants. Advanced standing means that applicants may be granted credit for up to two subjects or 30 credit points. Advanced standing of 30 credit points will result in a 25 per cent deduction in tuition fees.

Articulation with Doctor of Juridical Science (SJD)

The Doctor of Juridical Science (SJD) is a research doctorate in Law that allows students to either gain advanced qualification in law for further career advancement or pursue academic career. The doctorate combines coursework and research with a required thesis length of 55 000 – 60 000 words.

Applicants must have completed an Australian Master's degree or Bachelor's degree with Honours at H1 or H2A level, or approved international equivalent, plus at least three years of relevant professional experience. Applicants are also required to provide evidence of research expertise.

English Language Requirements and Direct Entry Program

International students applying for postgraduate courses at La Trobe University must provide evidence of their English language proficiency. The standard English language requirement for entry into law for applicants not educated in English is an IELTS result of 6.5; with no individual band score less than 6.0. Other tests and courses are accepted by the University. Details are available at:
