<sup>1</sup> Electives are normally taken in three of the four semesters in years 2 and 3. Any subject of university study may be taken for an elective as long as:

- it is worth at least 15cp (credit points),
- no more than 150cp in the course is taken at first year level,
- prerequisite rules are satisfied and
- time tabling of the subject does not clash with course core subjects.

#### Methods for Secondary Teacher Qualification

Graduates meet the Victorian Institute of Teaching requirements for the teaching methods

- Outdoor Education (including Environmental Studies) and
- SOSE (Geography)

Eligibility for another method may be achieved through elective subjects:

- Geography: + OED2RCS Regional Catchment Studies (core geography subjects OED1RAL, OED1OEE, OED2ACL)
- Biology: + 3 x Biology subjects (two of which must be year 2 level or above) (core biology subject OED1RAL)
- Further methods will usually require more than three additional subjects necessitating over enrolment. See the VIT Specialist Area Guidelines document at <http://www.vit.vic.edu.au> under Teacher Education.
