ADMISSIONS POLICY

Purpose/ objectives	This policy outlines the principles and framework for the admission of students into the University's undergraduate and postgraduate coursework programs.
Scope/ Application	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All local and international applicants for admission into the University's undergraduate and postgraduate coursework programs. • Higher Degree by Research and Professional Doctorate applicants can access admissions information from www.latrobe.edu.au/research and are not covered by this policy.
Policy Statement	<p>The University's admission policy and practices are designed to put into effect the following principles:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Admission offers are made to applicants who are judged to have the background and abilities to have a reasonable expectation of success in the program to which they are made an offer and who are likely to benefit from university study. • Admission offers are made broadly on merit based on demonstrated achievement, especially academic achievement, but may also take account of other factors such as demonstrated commitment and specific achievements. • The University will publish, for the benefit of prospective applicants, the course selection criteria to be applied in each course of study. • The University seeks to provide access to persons who have experienced educational or social disadvantage and to address the under-representation of specific community groups in university education. • The University seeks to engage with and serve its communities, including the residents of the regions in which the University is located. <p>To be considered for admission to the University, applicants must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be eligible for admission to the University, as defined in the Application and Selection Procedures or published from time to time in the Handbook; and • have lodged an application for admission to the University or via a Tertiary Admission Centre; and • have satisfied any course prerequisites or additional selection criteria established for entry to a particular course; and • be at least 16 years of age by 31 December in the year prior to admission; and • demonstrate an adequate command of English, where a course of study is given in the English language <p><u>Deferment</u></p> <p>The University will allow commencing undergraduate students to defer their studies for a maximum of twenty four months except in those courses where permitting deferral would impact on the course or student.</p> <p>The University will normally not allow commencing postgraduate or non-AQF award course students to defer their studies.</p>
