Sally Fawkes is Senior Lecturer in the School of Public Health, coordinating the Public Health Policy Unit offered through the Victorian Consortium of Public Health MPH program. She is also currently writing up her PhD thesis on the use of futures studies in public health policy-making which used a 3-country (Australia, UK, USA) case study methodology. Sally became interested in 'wide-lens' strategy and foresight while studying for her MBA at Monash in the early 1990s. At La Trobe over the last few years, as well as some lecturing and tutoring, Sally has collaborated with Professor Vivian Lin and other colleagues on a range of WHO projects covering topics including public health leadership development, regional strategy for health promotion, national health capacity mapping and policy to support patient-centred health systems in the Asia-Pacific context.
