

## BACHELOR OF PSYCHOLOGICAL SCIENCE (BPsySc)

### NOTES FOR RE-ENROLLING STUDENTS 2009

The following notes are to assist you in your re-enrolment. Please read them in conjunction with the advice you will receive from Student Administration.

#### Course structure

The Bachelor of Psychological Science degree requires at least 360 credit points, consisting of 120 credit points accrued from units taken at each of the first, second and third-year levels. An additional requirement is that students must take psychology units at second and third-year level of not less than 120 credit points and to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 150 credit points of psychology units across the three years of the degree.

#### NOTE TO ALL STUDENTS

- the total number of credit points may be greater than 120 in any year, but must not exceed 140 credit points, without permission from the course adviser
- enrolments exceeding 120 credit points in any year will accrue proportionately higher HECS liabilities for that year

- prerequisite requirements are often waived for units that are of interest to Psychology students from electives offered by other departments. Check this with the department offering the unit/s that you might be interested in.
- student number quotas and timetabling clashes might affect final choices.
