## Scholarships for Current Students

Applying for scholarships is a great way to not only relieve some of the financial burden of coming to university, but also gives you practice at writing and submitting applications – an important skill in many industries. The number of people who apply for scholarships is lower than you think, and you may be eligible to receive one without you even knowing it.

The Federal Government has announced that from 1 January, 2010 the existing Commonwealth Scholarships: Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarship (CECS), Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship (CAS), National Priority Scholarship (NPS), and National Accommodation Scholarship (NAS) **will be replaced** by two new Commonwealth Scholarships, which will be administered by Centrelink:

The Federal Government have advised that the Start-Up and Relocation Scholarships will be available to all continuing university students who meet the eligibility criteria set down by Centrelink.

As a result of these changes, La Trobe University will no longer be offering any new non-Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarships. For further information about scholarships go to: [www.latrobe.edu.au/scholarships/](http://www.latrobe.edu.au/scholarships/)

**Note:** Existing recipients of CECS, CAS, NPS and NAS, awarded by La Trobe University prior to 2010, will continue to retain their scholarship and have their scholarship payments paid directly by La Trobe University under existing arrangements.

This service means you can request documents that are not held in the La Trobe University Library collection but can be sourced from within Australia.

Undergraduate students can request copy from chapters of books, conference papers and specific journal and newspaper articles.
