Gender Affirming Voice and Communication

What is the Gender Affirming Voice Clinic?

Our clinic provides individual and group programs for gender affirming voice and communication training. Skilled voice clinicians and speech pathology students support this service.

For more than four decades, voice research undertaken at La Trobe has informed clinical practice locally and internationally. This ongoing research keeps the service at the forefront of new developments and ensures the service provided is based on research and client needs.

Voice and communication training consists of a series of components:

Voice Education Information

Before attending our clinic, you will be invited to a group education day to learn important information to prepare your voice before starting training, including:

- Voice production
- The differing voice and communication characteristics we can explore in clinic
- Vocal health

Voice and Communication Training

Voice and communication training consists of a series of components:

- Pre-training voice education
- Assessment
- A block of training sessions. These may be a mix of individual and group sessions
- A break from training for self-directed consolidation of techniques
- Group days for those who want to practice their techniques

Assessing Your Voice

Before training begins, we complete a comprehensive voice assessment to help us understand your unique voice and tailor the program to your needs.

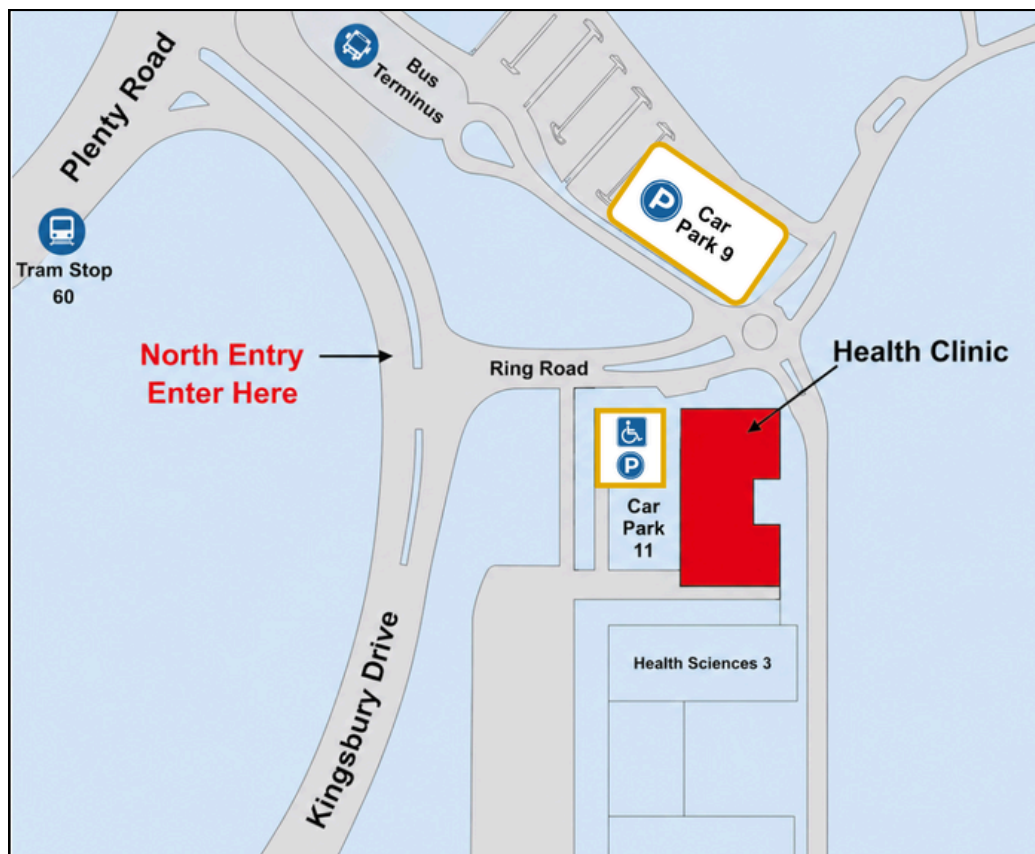
We only accept card payment – no cash.
