"Complex interventions" in the 1990s

- PubMed
 - -7 reviews
 - **-1 RCT**
 - 3 other studies evaluating interventions
 - 1 methodological paper
 - 4 letters/commentaries



"Complex interventions" since 2000

PubMed

- -40 reviews
- 12 RCTs & 3 protocols for RCTs
- 10 other studies evaluating interventions
- 25 methodological papers
- 9 papers reporting formative evaluation
 &/or process evaluation
- 4 letters/commentaries

- 'Cluster' randomisation
 - sample size calculations
 - analysis methods
- Engaging stakeholders in 'pragmatic' (real world) settings
- Unpacking the 'black-box'

Public policy in the 1990s

- Neo-liberalism
- Economic rationalism
- Efficiency, productivity, 'free market'
- Privatisation



Public policy under Kennett (1992-1999)

- Local government amalgamations
 - 210 municipalities reduced to 78
 - State government appointed commissioners replaced elected councillors
- Economic rationalism
 - Compulsory competitive tendering (CCT)
 - Privatisation



The Howard years (1996-2007)

- Industrial relations
- Tax & welfare 'reform'
- Privatisation
- Opposed to 'Native Title' and request for apology to Stolen Generations
- Anti asylum-seeker policy
- Iraq and 'war on terror'
