Who we are

The Bouverie Centre is an integrated Practice-Research-Translation Centre of La Trobe University. We are also the funded state-wide provider of specialist family therapy services to families and of specialist systemic training across mental health and allied fields.

Established in Melbourne in 1956, the Bouverie Centre is Australia's largest family therapy organisation. At our core, we strive to sustain a culture of quality and innovation that grows systemic knowledge, fosters expertise, and makes family therapy a timely and worthwhile investment for families in distress.

Our pillars



All four functions are supported by our dedicated family therapy practice, teaching and research teams, and each centrally involves our First Nations staff.

Our purpose

We believe healthy relationships lie at the heart of social and emotional health. Every stage of life, all cultures and circumstances matter to our work, and create the context for change. Within each family's context, we create opportunities with families to develop well in the face of acute and chronic distress and shape their ability to care for themselves and others during challenging times.

We are guided by a deep systemic research focus and a determination to translate our new knowledge into action. Our research team offers end-to-end enrichment of all we do with and for families in need. We partner with government and with multiple services in allied health and mental health sectors, at state and national levels. We help to form and answer tough questions central to providing family sensitive practices. Our extensive training programs in systemic practices then helps to support practitioners in implementing evidence-enriched practices within their context of responding to the needs of families and communities.





In 2023:



57 published papers and books/chapters, conference papers and technical reports



18 partnered externally funded projects



08 completed systematic reviews for industry and government partners



La Trobe University funded a First Nations postdoctoral Research Fellow and two First Nations PhD students, to be recruited into the Bouverie Centre's team in 2024.



Beyond 2023



We are mid-completion of a critically important project into increasing safety in the face of family violence, during Family Court processes. This is an ARC funded project, **in partnership** with **Relationships Australia**, **South Australia** and the **Family Courts of Australia**.



We always welcome new projects, and the chance to co-create new knowledge in the family and systemic space.

Our family therapy service

Each year Bouverie is funded as a demonstration service to develop and test specialist family centred practices and to work directly with 200 families experiencing distress related to a member's mental health, alcohol and/or drug misuse, or trauma. We have specialist teams who see First Nations families and LGBTIO+ families.

In 2023:

The **big news** was this: Our **Walk-In Together service** was fully established. This provides a same day telehealth family session, with 2-3 specialist family therapists. Our evidence on the effectiveness of **this service continues to grow**.



65 families attended our Walk-in Together service.



In our annual survey, **96% of families** said they would recommend the Bouverie Centre's Family Therapy Program to other families in need.





Clinical Innovation & Cultural Safety in Action

Working with Women in Prison

Following the success of the initial three-year project (2020-2023), the Bouverie Centre's **Strengthening Connections** for Women in Prison program continues to be offered at Dame Phyllis Frost and Tarrengower Prisons.

The three-level program (group, individual and family sessions) is delivered by Indigenous and non-Indigenous staff, and is designed to:

- assist women in custody strengthen healthy connections with family and others
- increase successful re-integration from prison back to the family unit
- decrease the risk of re-offending.



Our Practice and Service Development

In 2023:



2,275 participants completed at least one online learning course.



2,300 people trained in person at the Bouverie Centre.



Nearly **500** people completed our *Guide to Genograms* within one month of its launch - free for all Victorian health care sector workers.

Each year, the Bouverie Centre and Victorian Department of Health co-design activities to build workforce capacity in family practices.

In 2023:

- partnering with a regional Adult Mental Health 'Local' to create a better family inclusive service
- developing training resources to improve dissemination of family practices
- a PhD scholarship focussed on workforce capacity building for family inclusion
- a rapid evidence review of relationally-based approaches to trauma
- supporting the Aged Care and Alcohol and Other Drug sectors in working with families.





Workforce Capacity Building in Action

The Bouverie Centre is an active player at the design table of mental health reform, bringing our systemic view of mental health to specifically address the needs of families in the mental health system.

In 2023, we:

- co-ordinated and conducted the Victorian program FaPMI (Families where a Parent has a Mental Illness) across 22 adult mental health and wellbeing services
- led the implementation and evaluation of Single Session Family Consultation (with a FaPMI lens) across metropolitan and regional services
- completed a three-part study of the identification and support for young people with caring responsibilities in the context of adult mental health and wellbeing services, and alcohol and other drug services
- provided expert advice to the national mental health sector via several key governance groups, and through contributing to the Department of Health's mental health workforce capability framework: *Our workforce, our future*.



Our Family and Systemic Practice Training

In 2023:







Engaged and trained over **3,000 professionals** from a diverse range of settings: **nursing**, **maternal and child health**, **social work**, **psychology**, **youth work**, **psychiatry** and more.



94% to 96% of participants reported being either "satisfied" or "extremely satisfied" with the content, presentation and relevance of our trainings and courses.

Our Academic Program

The Bouverie Centre is an accredited provider of Family Therapy training, with world class programs delivered through the School of Psychology and Public Health, La Trobe University.



28 students successfully completed the Master's degree.



25 completed the Graduate Certificate in Family Therapy/First year of the Master of Clinical Family Therapy.



Survey data shows our courses scored above both the School of Psychology and Public Health and the La Trobe University averages for overall student satisfaction.



We will welcome our 17th First Nations Cohort in 2024, to complete the Graduate Certificate in Family Therapy, First Nations.
