Our student-led podiatry clinic delivers high quality clinical care to the community, assessing and managing a wide range of foot and ankle conditions. Appointments are provided by podiatry students and closely supervised by registered and experienced podiatrists, ensuring safe, high-quality and evidence-based care.

By choosing our clinic, you receive affordable care while supporting the training of future allied health professionals.

What does a podiatrist do?

A podiatrist specialises in the assessment, diagnosis and treatment of foot, ankle and lower limb conditions. They can help people of all ages with foot health, helping to improve comfort, mobility and function.

What we offer

We provide assessment and management for a wide range of foot and ankle conditions for children and adults, including:

- Routine skin and nail care
- Diabetes foot assessment
- Foot pain and sports injuries
- Custom orthotics
- Footwear assessment
- Ingrown toenails, including minor surgical procedures
- Gait concerns (toe walking, in-toeing, out-toeing, bowlegs or knock knees)
- Growing pains
- Callus and corn management
- Warts

As a teaching clinic, appointments may take up to 90 minutes.

What should I bring to my appointment?

Please bring your usual footwear, any relevant medical history, medication list, referral documents and orthotics (if applicable).

How much will it cost?

We offer affordable fees as part of our student-led service. For the latest fees, visit our website or contact us directly.

Please note as this is a student-led service, we are unable to offer appointments under Medicare, private health insurance, TAC or WorkCover. We currently do not offer appointments under NDIS.

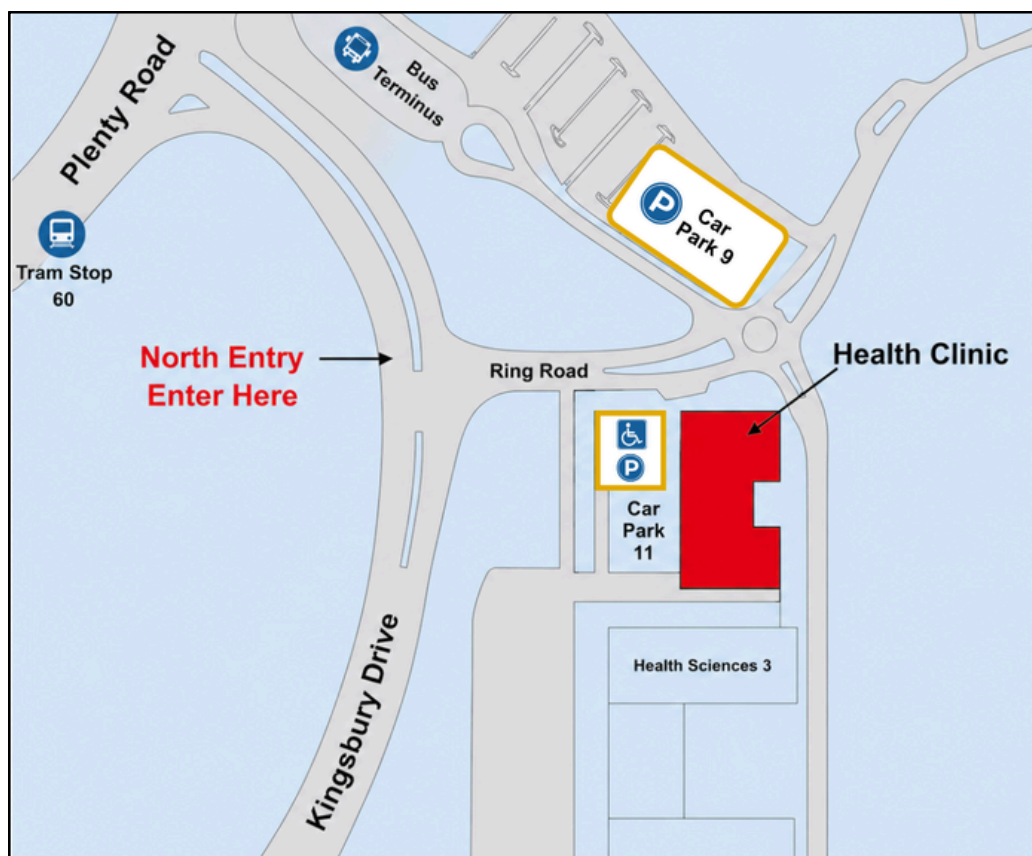
We only accept card payment – no cash.
