Subject Description:

In this subject students will study the concepts, structure and content of the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) for Physical Education (PE) (Units 1-4) with the aim of developing discipline knowledge and understanding to be able to implement study design details within the classroom context. Particular emphasise will be placed on the complex relationship between curriculum, teaching and assessment to design learning sequences that use a range of teaching strategies to maximise student learning in this curriculum area that align with relevant curriculum frameworks.

Assessment Details (including Assessment Criteria)

This assessment task requires pre-service teachers to write a succinct reflective journal of learning based on the topic/theme for each week.

Assessment Criteria

- Criterion 1: Demonstrates knowledge and understanding the weeks topic/theme
- Criterion 2: Synthesises weeks topic/theme into own words
- Criterion 3: Meaningful reflection of learning the relates to the weeks topic/theme
- In this assessment task pre-service teachers will be required to make a short video clip (vodcast) of 2-3 minutes introducing a topic from Units 1 or 2 from the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) for Physical Education that could be used as a resource with senior secondary students. This video is designed for Year 11/12 students as an introduction to a new unit. The video is to include the following components:
 - An introduction to the unit/topic.
 - Appropriate use of images and resources to assist the learner to understand the content.
 - Clear explanation and logical sequence of information.
 - Summary of main points

Assessment Criteria

- Criterion 1: Introduction is clear and easy to understand and relevant for Year 11/12 learners
- Criterion 2: Appropriate resources used in the podcast to assist the learner to understand the content
- Criterion 3: Discipline knowledge and alignment with unit
- Criterion 4: Convention and presentation
- 3 Online exam

In this assessment task pre-service teachers will be required to review a past VCE written examination for Physical Education.

Select one topic from section B (past paper will be provided) and develop a unit of work that would reflect the approach to teaching this topic. In designing this unit of work attention must be paid to detailing the complex relationship between curriculum, teaching and assessment.

The following will be required in this task

- A brief rationale outlining the approach taken to teaching this unit.
- The resources required.
- Teaching strategies.
- Assessment including the approach to feedback and reporting.
- The approach to discipline knowledge and alignment with the study design.



• Approach to developing literacy and numeracy.

Assessment Criteria

Criterion 3: Teaching strategies are appropriate for the unit

Criterion 4: Assessment, feedback and/or reporting is articulated and appropriate
