Other issues highlighted were:

- (a) A report had been leaked in *The Australian* today concerning the University's cash flow. The Vice-Chancellor advised that it was regrettable that he had been unable to speak to staff first about the report. It was further noted that this was a simple accounting error whereby it was thought that the University had better cash reserves than it did and would have no affect any of the Funding Future Ready Program initiatives.
- (b) Another article in *The Australian* today reporting on the University's discussions with Suisse and the University's plan to establish an independent Complementary Medicine Evaluation Centre. It was noted that the University would maintain complete independence regarding research and that scientific rigour was integral.
- (c) *Enrolments* – the University was on track to achieve the targets which had allowed for significant growth this year. The Vice-Chancellor thanked all staff who had worked so hard regarding acceptances and retention.
- (d) In response to a query regarding whether the new online enrolment processes had been successful, the Board was advised that enrolment online was an important customer service initiative but it had provided a lower actual yield than paper based enrolment as a result of offering more options for enrolment (ie students are provided with options to enrol for a semester, part of a semester etc).
- (e) In response to a query regarding media reports about significantly lowered ATARs, the Vice-Chancellor advised that La Trobe was slower than most institutions to reduce ATARs. It was also noted that there is not a strong correlation between ATAR scores and retention and success.

PART D – DISCUSSION

470.5 La Trobe in the Asian Century

Professor Simon Crowe, Chair, Academic Board introduced the discussion panel:

- (a) Professor Nick Bisley, Executive Director, La Trobe Asia

Professor Bisley gave a brief overview of the newly established La Trobe Asia and the opportunities and challenges that have arisen with the emergence of Asia as an economic power. He spoke to a presentation which can be accessed at the following link:

overview of what an international cohort at La Trobe looks like and outlined the great potential to offer students a broader range of opportunities.

Discussion:

- In response to a query regarding transnational education (TNE) opportunities, it was noted that a decision regarding whether La Trobe will move into that space should be made by the middle of the year.
- In response to a query regarding what he saw as LTU's strengths regarding the Asian market in comparison to our competition, the Executive Director, La Trobe Asia noted:
 - LTU the only University in Victoria (and only one of two in the country) to teach the four main Asian languages listed in the Gillard Government's White Paper.
 - Best library holdings of South Asian collections outside of India.

- Good relations and partnerships built over more than 20 years – LTU has been interested in the Asian market since before it was popular.
- It was noted that the University provides credit to students for almost all of the outgoing programs, even the short terms ones.
- It was queried whether the destinations for exchanges could be better matched with the languages taught.
- It was suggested that the University utilise the cultural experiences that could be shared by the international student cohort in classrooms here.
