Host Organisation Background:

The Nangak Tamboree Wildlife Sanctuary is a 30 hectare open range habitat restoration project that engages extensively with the university and broader community, forming an essential biodiversity node within Nangak Tamboree eco-corridor, connecting the Sanctuary with Gresswell Habitat Link and Gresswell Forest to our north, through the Bundoora campus to Darebin Creek in the south.

The Wildlife Sanctuary is a true wildlife sanctuary, we focus on looking after and enhancing the habitat for the local wildlife. As such, we do not offer animal handling or husbandry experiences.

We have an indigenous nursery which supplies plants to local councils and other land managers as well as backyard gardeners. Our schools outreach program delivers a range of hands-on environmental education activities to primary and secondary schools.

Key Duties and Responsibilities

The role will involve working across all areas of the Wildlife Sanctuary to get a broad range of experiences and understanding of what we do. Some activities may be booking or seasonally dependent, but possible activities include:

- Land management activities such as invasive species control and track maintenance.

- Predator proof fence inspections.
- Plant production such as seed or collection of cuttings and pricking out of plants.
- Collating and cleaning of plants for wholesale orders.
- Undertaking water quality testing.
- Assisting with tour or other educational activities.
- Preparation of content for social media.

The focus project will include assisting with:

- Updating tree and nesting box register for all trees within the Wildlife Sanctuary and surrounding managed lands, by recording:
 - Species
 - Tree health
 - DBH
 - Possum activity
 - Habitat quality
 - Nest box occupancy
 - Bridging vegetation
- Assisting with nest box restoration and repairs
- Compilation of a report on current status of trees and nest boxes

Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated ability to work as a team and independently.
- Excellent attention to detail and ability to undertake repetitive work.
- Confidence in working in a range of terrains in all weather conditions.
- Demonstrated understanding in computer software systems, including Word, Excel and databases.
