

NANGAK TAMBOREE WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

The Nangak Tamboree Wildlife Sanctuary is 30 hectare area of River Red Gum Grassy Woodland, dedicated to the conservation and restoration of Australian flora and fauna indigenous to the Bundoora area.

The Sanctuary was set up in 1967 and has been regenerated from a degraded farming landscape into a river red gum grassy woodland reminiscent of what this area was like prior to European colonisation. Over time the Sanctuary has transformed into a leading educational facility – La Trobe's Outdoor Laboratory.

Please be aware of changing environmental conditions when moving around the Sanctuary. Tracks may become slippery when wet at certain times of the year.



STAY ON PATH
Minimise disturbance to sensitive plants and animals.



KEEP ANIMALS WILD
Do not attempt to feed, touch or approach the wildlife.
