The Vice-Chancellor spoke to the report and reported the following additional items:

- (a) Federal Budget Update
 - UA will not oppose fee deregulation.
 - The situation should become clearer in the next 2-3 weeks and the Vice-Chancellor will ensure that University staff and students are kept fully informed.
- (b) Thanked Dr Liz Johnson for her substantial contribution during her time at La Trobe and wished her all the best in her future role of Pro Vice-Chancellor (Learning and Teaching) at Deakin University.
- (c) It had been reported that there has been some debate amongst the student body regarding the Gaza situation and reports in the media regarding mistreatment of Jewish students at La Trobe. The University is taking this seriously and would appreciate being advised if anyone is aware of any instances of mistreatment of members of the student body.

Funding Future Ready Program Update

The Board received and noted paper AB14/101, the Funding Future Ready Program Report. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Future Ready) also provided a verbal update on a number of issues:

- FFR has generated 17 change proposals. 16 were released between 15 June and 3 July 2014.
- The EOI process had commenced for Student Services, with all others still in consultation with a tentative commencement date of 18 August.
- Much feedback has been received with changes to the proposals being made as a result.
- Issues Management meetings are being held four times a week.
- A detailed transition plan has been endorsed by the Vice-Chancellor and the Steering Group.
- Communications have focussed on stakeholder groups with regular updates to all staff and meetings held with student representatives.

Dr Jillian Murray provided the following query with notice to the Vice-Chancellor:

Can the Vice Chancellor provide Academic Board with the necessary information so that it is able to ensure that the Funding Future Ready proposals will not negatively impact upon the quality of teaching,

learning and research at the University?

The Vice-Chancellor responded by advising it was clearly within the remit of the Board to ensure that issues of quality are addressed during implementation of the change process and stated that the University needs to change the way things are done and the OCIS proposals contain quite radical changes including:

- Streamlining course and subject profiles.
- New pedagogy, blended and on-line learning.
- Clear strategies to improve research.
- Ensuring academic staff spend less time on governance and administration.
- Changes to support services (Finance/HR etc) to ensure academic staff are properly supported.

The University will continue to monitor the impact of the changes and will continually review the process.

Dr Murray stated that the OCIS documentation does not appear to ensure that academic quality will be maintained and requested that it be noted that she believed that the Vice-Chancellor's answer to her query was that Academic Board would not be given the appropriate materials to ensure that the Funding Future Ready proposals would not negatively impact upon academic quality at the University. The Vice-Chancellor did not accept Dr Murray's assertion.

The Vice-Chancellor advised that the University was seeking to provide certainty for all staff as soon as possible and that it was understood by the senior executive team that this was a difficult and distressing time for staff.

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Future Ready) responded to a query regarding whether the actual number of academic staff to be made redundant was known by advising that it would be approximately 150.

474.6 Bigger, Brighter, Better: Pyne's Vision for Higher Ed

Dr Scanlon made the following suggestions regarding possible curriculum innovations in response to reforms in higher education:

- Grow the market by building on existing partnerships with co-located TAFEs

regarding articulation and pathways and build on our connections with local communities.

- Additional focus on markets that are untapped (ie targeting/contacting students that have partially completed degrees and trying to get them to return and finish).
- More flexible offerings and support for students who increasingly have outside commitments (ie work, family etc).
- MOOCs – look at using it in the postgraduate space. Use it as the core of courses and then bolster this with our own staff.
- More flexible delivery – blended and on-line learning. Curate the proliferating range of high quality resources available on line rather than duplicating this content creation.
- Marketing staff and business case processes should become more involved in the course development process earlier on.
- Forming connections with students earlier than we currently do.

Discussion:

- Professor Di Iorio suggested that the University needed to be proactive not reactive and 'nimble'.
- In response to a query regarding the Panel's thoughts on progress the University was making in pre-degree markets, it was suggested that courses be established quickly in response to market forces; relationships be further built on with TAFEs; and that high quality private providers be looked at.
