

I am very pleased to share our first Annual Report and I hope you find its reading rewarding and encouraging. We are very excited about the opportunities lying ahead.






The Philippines-Australia Forum (PAF) at La Trobe University is a forum under La Trobe Asia funded by the Philippine government and the Philippine Consulate General in Melbourne through a Deed of Gift signed on 31 July 2022 to advance Philippine Studies and engagement at La Trobe University and beyond. It builds on the work and legacy of the previous La Trobe's Philippines Australia Studies Centre (PASC), to continue furthering academic interests in Philippine Studies in Australia and internationally.

PAF at La Trobe brings together academics, students and interested members of the public (including the Filipino Diaspora). The network has grown over the past 12 months to almost 200 members from the Philippines and Australia. PAF has hosted in-person, online and hybrid events through the Philippines in Focus Seminar Series and featured academics, scholars and community leaders in Australia and the Philippines from a variety of institutions including the University of the Philippines (UP) Diliman, Ateneo de Manila University, Deakin University, Monash University, Griffith University and University of Technology Sydney. The forum also organised a discussion panel with the Philippine Consulate General in Melbourne to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of Philippine Independence in June 2023.

PAF at La Trobe also has a strong relationship with the Filipino community in Australia through the forum's relationship with the Filipino-Australian Students Council of Victoria (FASTCO). PAF at La Trobe and FASTCO partnered to deliver the annual International Research Forum on the Philippines (IRFP) conference on 10–11 July 2023 with the main theme of: Transcending Boundaries – The Filipino Diaspora in Action.

The forum also worked with the La Trobe University Library to re-organise and revive the Philippine Collection of materials and books from the Borchardt library and launched a limited-time exhibition on 26 July 2023. In support of advancing Philippine Studies, PAF at La Trobe have also awarded six research grants to La Trobe University academics to conduct collaborative research projects in the Philippines. PAF at La Trobe works under La Trobe Asia, with the direction and collaboration of comparative law and politics specialist Dr Raul Sanchez Urribarri (Director) and Rei Fortes (Program Coordinator).



Director - La Trobe Asia

Dr Bec Strating is the Director of La Trobe Asia and an Associate Professor of Politics and International Relations at La Trobe University, Melbourne. I received my PhD from Monash University in 2013. My research focuses on maritime disputes in Asia and Australian foreign and defence policy.

Dr Strating has written three sole-authored books, most recently Defending the Maritime Rules-Based Order (2020), co-edited special journal issues and one book (Australia on the World Stage, 2022), and written multiple journal articles and book chapters. In 2018, I was awarded the prestigious Boyer Prize by the Australian Institute of International Affairs for best article published in the Australian Journal of International Affairs.

Dr Strating the program lead for the DFAT-funded "Blue Security" network focused on maritime security issues in the Indo-Pacific. I am currently a non-visiting fellow at the Royal Australian Navy's Seapower Centre, a member of the East West Centre Council on Indo-Pacific Relations, and incoming chair of the Women in International Security Australia's steering committee.

Dr Raul Sanchez Urribarri is the current Director of La Trobe's Philippines Australia Forum (PAF La Trobe). He is Associate Dean (Academic and International Partnerships) at the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and Senior Lecturer in Crime, Justice and Legal Studies at the Department of Social Inquiry, La Trobe University.

Dr Sanchez Urribarri has a strong interest in the internationalisation of higher education, particularly on strategy, partnership building, international mobility, and intercultural teaching. He is the Deputy Convener of the Teaching and Learning Network of the International Education Association of Australia (IEAA), and Vice-President of the U.S. based Consortium for Undergraduate Law and Justice Programs (CULJP). He is also a co-editor at Thesis Eleven Journal (SAGE), and past Chair of the Section on Venezuelan Studies at the Latin American Studies Association (LASA).

Dr Sanchez Urribarri holds a PhD in Political Science from the University of South Carolina, a Master of Laws (LLM) from Cambridge University and a Law degree from Universidad Catolica Andres Bello (Caracas, Venezuela). His research focuses on constitutionalism, judicial politics, and the rule of law in comparative perspective, with an emphasis on contexts of democratic deterioration.

Rei Fortes is a Program Coordinator for the Philippines-Australia Forum (PAF) at La Trobe University. His primarily role involves building PAF at La Trobe's network by planning and organising events with internal and external partners from the Filipino-Australian Diaspora. Rei also manages PAF at La Trobe's communications with the network through a mailing list and various social media platforms.

He has worked with the Philippine Consulate General in Melbourne to organise an event celebrating the 125th Anniversary of Philippine Independence in June 2023. Rei also re-established La Trobe University's relationship with the Filipino-Australia Students Council of Victoria (FASTCO) and helped organise the 2023 International Research Forum on the Philippines (IRFP) in July. Rei is also a Bachelor of Media and Communications (Journalism) graduate from La Trobe University. Outside of work, he enjoys exploring new cuisines, travelling and listening to music.

PAF at La Trobe held its last event on the 26 July 2023 with the launch of the Philippine Collection Exhibition at La Trobe University's Borchardt library. The event is the culmination of a project initiated in February 2023 with the mission of revitalising over 600 books and materials about the Philippines acquired by Dietrich Borchardt, the founding librarian, at La Trobe University since the late-1960s.

Our team worked with Mr David Groenewegen the current Head Librarian at La Trobe University and Ms Adele Walsh Senior Coordinator of Library Community Programs and Engagement to help re-organise, increase the visibility and allow the Philippine Collection to be more accessible for the community.

Dr Robert Nery, an Honorary Associate in Sociology (recommended by Dr Trevor Hogan) was hired to go through the collection and organise the resources to have a clearer understanding of the size and range of the Philippine Collection.

Dr Nery also assisted in hand picking books from the Philippine Collection to display at the limited time exhibition and was involved in writing the didactics for the books on display. Finally, he also developed and created a bibliography of more than 600 materials and books found in the Philippine Collection today – a list that will be updated as more resources are discovered.

Currently, the collection is widely diverse and includes historical and scientific works about Philippine flora and fauna from the early 1800s to the 1940s and research in sociology, anthropology, and health and medicine. Several books in the collection also highlight indigenous groups in the Philippines such as the Ifugao and Abellen Aytas people groups.

Research

Over the past year, PAF at La Trobe also had the opportunity to award six research grants to La Trobe University and academics from Australian institutions conducting research with collaborations in the Philippines. One of the grant recipients includes a research project under the New Colombo Plan initiative.

Several of the research collaborators include: Ateneo de Manila University, Eastern Visayas State University, University of the Philippines, National Museum of the Philippines, Scalabrini Migration Centre in Quezon City and ASEAN-ACT.

Dr Brooke Wilmsen's research on **Exploring the Impacts of Climate Gentrification in Coastal Cities in the Philippines** has seen success. She presented a talk about her research at Eastern Visayas State University (EVSU) and garnered a lot of attention on how her findings can help improve the situations of climate relocation gentrification in cities such as Tacloban and Leyte.

Dr Wilmsen conducted field studies in the region with researchers from La Trobe University and ESVU and was featured in an article on <u>ESVU's website</u>.

Dr Wilmsen also received an extension of her partnership and further funding for her research with ESVU, Ateneo de Manila University (AdMU) and Visayas State University (VSU) through an ARC Discovery/Linkage project.

She has informed PAF at La Trobe that two students, one from ESVU and one from EVU will be applying to La Trobe University in 2024 as a result of this research project.





Art & Culture: Supporting upcoming Australian and Filipino creative artists

The Philippines-Australia Forum (PAF) at La Trobe University aims to venture beyond the world of academia and as a forum plans to expand in creating a space for upcoming Filipino and Australian creative artists to showcase their work and engage in cultural exchange beyond national borders.

This goal builds upon the previous programs initiated by Dr Trevor Hogan at La Trobe University in bringing Filipino artists to Melbourne and flying Australian creatives to Manila.

PAF at La Trobe aims to re-ignite these initiative with the next generation of creative artists.
