Accessing Mental Health Services for Older People: Who should I call for help?

About the webinar topic

Residents in aged care services have a high prevalence of specific mental health disorders such as depression and anxiety. The rates of other mental health conditions such as schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorders, psychosis, autism spectrum disorder and personality disorders are similar to that found in community dwellers.

There are a range of mental health services:

- > Psychologists, General Practitioners, Psychiatrists
- Aged persons mental health services
- > Forensic mental health
- Psychological treatment services targeting mental health through Primary Health Networks, which may include in-reach services
- Dementia Support Australia, Severe Behaviour Response Team and Specialist Dementia Care Unit

This webinar will explore what is available for older people in residential aged care and how these services are accessed. The webinar will clarify referral patterns and patient eligibility for mental health services.

Who is the keynote speaker?

Dr Terry Chong

Psychiatrist and Clinician Researcher, Department of Psychiatry at University of Melbourne.

Terry is a Senior Research Fellow – Psychiatry of Old Age at St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne, Department of Psychiatry. He is involved in research around cognitive health and cognitive impairment as well as physical activity, anxiety and Huntington's disease. In 2018, he was awarded membership to the Melbourne Medical School Academy of Clinical Teachers and he teaches medical students and psychiatrists in training through the Master of Psychiatry course. He advocates increasing community awareness of cognitive health, for example, in the media and community forums. He also practices as a psychiatrist at St Vincent's Health and Epworth Healthcare. In 2021, Terry was elected to the Board of Directors of the International Psychogeriatric Association.
