Publication and launch of *Disability Practice*: Safeguarding Quality Service Delivery book

Disability Practice: Safeguarding Quality Service Delivery, edited by our director Professor Christine Bigby and Dr Alan Hough, director at Purpose at Work, was published by Springer in late 2023 by and subsequently launched at a workshop event on February 15, 2024. More than 100 guests attended the launch event, which featured presentations from the editors and most of the contributing authors.

The book provides a key resource for researchers, students and practitioners in the field of disability practice. It is accessibly written, in a colloquial and approachable language, but grounded in research. It fills a major gap in the literature on quality and safeguarding in disability services.
