







# WHAT DO WE KNOW?

Women and men experience disability at similar rates


















## WHAT DO WE KNOW?

However, women ...

... are only 37% of National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) participants

Indeterminate/not recorded













## WHAT DO WE KNOW?

However, women ...

... are **less likely to find a support** provider that meets their needs

... have have been studied less than men in research on autism - and this is even worse for assigned female at birth (AFAB) non-binary people






**Gender Identity** Diagnostic Status









#### **Barriers to diagnosis**





#### Reasons participants don't access any formal supports (16.4%)

**Too expensive** 44.4%

I don't know how to access 33.3%

None in my area 22.2%

None suit my needs 22.2%

My family/friends support me 22.2%

Reasons participants don't access supports they need (96.4%)

**Too expensive** 63.6%

### **RESULTS**

#### Barriers experienced when applying to the NDIS

Caused me stress 69.9%

Caused me anxiety 65.2%

Was **emotionally draining** 65.2%

Took a long time 65.2%

Hard to understand how it works 65.2%

Hard to work out what I need to apply

#### Barriers experienced *since* being an NDIS participant

Hard to understand how to use funding 69.6%

It is **emotionally draining** 69.6%

**Communicating with LAC** is difficult 65.2%

**Communicating with NDIA** is difficult 60.9%

Causes me stress 56.5%

Causes me **anxiety** 56.5%



Main barriers to accessing diagnosis and supports are high costs, long waiting lists, lack of suitable services, and the amount of time the processes

Applying for and accessing NDIS has negative impacts on mental health

AFAB women and non-binary people accessing NDIS still experience barriers in accessing supports
