
Quick Guide to Genograms: Case Study 1 - Roz

Case notes:

Roz is a 37-year-old who uses the pronouns they/them and has agreed to a male symbol to represent them in a genogram. Roz is supported by two close friends who live separately, Cass aged 36 and Morgan aged 35. Cass identifies as female with pronouns she/her and Morgan identifies as a trans woman with pronouns they/them. Cass and Morgan have been closely involved in supporting Roz's recovery and have known Roz for 20 years. Roz was adopted at birth and does not know anything about their birth parents. Roz is in contact with their adopted parents Darren and Bev Peterson. Darren and Bev married in 1984. Darren is 60 and was born in 1962 and Bev is 59 and was born in 1963. Roz has two younger siblings. Miriam is 34 and is living with Jason 34. They have a son Ryan who is 5, born in 2017. Roz enjoys looking after Ryan. Roz's youngest sibling is John 29, born in 1983, who was born with Down syndrome. John lives at home with Darren and Bev, and Darren's younger brother Frank aged 59, who Roz describes as having a learning disability. Roz describes growing up and spending a lot of time with Bev's mother, Grandma Bab. Grandma Bab is 84. She was married in 1961 to Pops who died in 2021. Grandma Bab now lives with Bev's younger sister Lilly aged 58, who is married to Steven aged 59. They adopted a son Tim who is 27 years old. Bev's youngest sister Marion is 50 years old and is married to John, also aged 50. Marion and John have identical twins Ben and Jim who are 23 years old. Darren has an older sister Carmel who moved to America 10 years ago with her husband Steven and two children Jack and Chloe. Darren's mother Beryl died in 2000. Darren's father Stan is currently living in a nursing home and is 102 years old. Stan married Beryl in 1960.
