

La Trobe Wildlife Sanctuary

The La Trobe Wildlife Sanctuary is 30 hectare area of River Red Gum Grassy Woodland, dedicated to the conservation and restoration of native Australian flora and fauna.

The Sanctuary was set up in 1967 and has been regenerated from a degraded farming landscape into a river red gum grassy woodland reminiscent of what this area was like when the traditional custodians of this land, the Wurundjeri, still resided in this place. Over time the Sanctuary has transformed into a leading educational facility - La Trobe's Outdoor Laboratory.

Please be aware of changing environmental conditions when moving around the Sanctuary. Tracks may become slippery when wet at certain times of the year.
